S. WILLIAM ABEL ACADEMY ACHIEVES 6-YEAR ACCREDITATION

The Colusa County Office of Education (CCOE) is proud to announce that S. William Abel Academy has again achieved Accreditation status from the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). This 6-year Accreditation for Excellence in Education is the highest rating a school can achieve from the Accrediting Commission for Schools (ACS).

"I am extremely proud of the leadership and staff at CCOE's S. William Abel Academy with their achievement of a 6-year WASC Accreditation," Colusa County Superintendent of Schools Michael P. West stated. "Assistant Superintendent John Ithurburn, Teacher Doug Horton, Teacher Erin Kalfsbeek, Art Teacher Specialist Bob Kirkman, Adult Education Coordinator Michelle Paraeducator Bingham, and Brittani Messina have demonstrated an incredible dedication and passion for all of our students in their pursuit of an education! We will continue to grow and develop expanding areas of education at our Academy," Superintendent West continued.

This Accreditation status is based on all of the information provided by the school, including the school's report, and the satisfactory completion of the accreditation visit. With S. William Abel Academy's continued adherence with the ACS WASC policies, procedures, and criteria for accreditation, this 6-year status will be in place through June 30, 2029.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

Welcome to a new school year, Colusa County families!

I hope each of you were able to find ways to relax and recharge over the summer vacation. As we begin this new school year, I feel it is important to address a growing trend in education - Chronic Absenteeism. A pupil is considered chronically absent if they miss 10% or more of the total school days in a year, including both excused and unexcused absences. This number can be calculated by dividing the number of days a student is absent by the total number of days school is in session. For example, if a student is absent 18 days out of a 180-day school year, they can be considered a chronic absentee as they were not present for 10% of the time.




In 2022, 26.3% of students in Colusa County and 30% of students statewide were chronically absent. Moreover, on average 8 million students nationwide are chronically absent each school year. As a result, children are at risk of falling behind academically. Our youngest learners may be unable to read well by the end of the third grade, and our oldest may find it difficult to finish their courses in order to graduate. This school year, it is critical that we find it within ourselves to help the students of Colusa County get to and stay in school.

While some absences cannot be avoided, it is essential to connect with your child's teacher should an absence occur, in order to keep your child on track with his or her peers. Each school is its own community, with neighbors and friends coming together to support one another in need. Do not be afraid to ask for help should you require it, and please know the Colusa County Office of Education is here to offer a helping hand. I wish all families, school staff, and students a happy start and a successful school year.

FREE SUMMER MEALS FOR COUNTY YOUTH



The Food Services team at the Education Village provided free breakfast and lunch to Colusa County students this summer, as has occurred in previous summers at the Williams location. Approximately 855 breakfasts and 977 lunches were provided in the month of June to Elementary, Middle, and High School Extended School Year (ESY) students, and to Williams Unified School (WUSD) students attending District Woodland classes at Community College. Additionally, in the month of July. 200 meals were served to WUSD

students. "I appreciate the ability to serve meals to students we would not normally reach," stated Food Services Supervsor Angela Fulcher. "My staff has grown attached to the ESY students and look forward to seeing them and interacting with them every summer, even if it's only for a few weeks."


