FAMILY ACTION CENTER PROVIDES FOOD TO COMMUNITY

The Arbuckle Family Action Center (AFAC) provides numerous programs and resources to the community of Arbuckle, and on January 25 the center hosted one of its monthly food distributions. This particular distribution was hosted in partnership with the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP). 7,020 pounds of food were supplied to 101 families (406 total family members) at this drive-thru event. First 5 Colusa's AFAC implements three food distributions per month.

COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE HOSTS QUARTERLY MEETINGS FOR COUNTY PARENTS

The CCOE Community Advisory (CAC) is a Committee legally mandated group formed to advise local governing bodies about issues which affect Colusa County children special education. Primarily composed of parents of special needs children, membership also includes representatives from public and private agencies concerned with individuals of exceptional needs. The CAC meets on a consistent basis and reviews decisions that impact children's education programs. The



body also provides a forum for parent-to-parent support, and decides what training is needed for parents to become better participants in their children's education programs. On February 7, the CAC organized a quarterly meeting with a training presented by Becca Banuelos, M.A., CCC-SLP. Becca is a CCOE speech and language therapist, and she discussed ways to support a child's communication development at home. The next CAC meeting will be on April 10, with the training topic to be announced.

CHILDREN'S SERVICES STAFF ATTEND CAREER EXPO

Maxwell High School held its annual College & Career Expo on January 18. Family Services Division Director Joe Moye, Recruitment Coordinator Ashlyn Ferreira, and Education Program Supervisor Cesilee Godinez were present at the event and provided informational materials to the middle and high school students in attendance.



VIRTUAL REALITY SHOWCASED AT COLUSA ROTARY

Michael P. West. Superintendent Technology Services Director Alex Evans, and IT Specialist Scott Waters were invited to present at the Colusa Rotary's February meeting. The topic? Virtual Reality and its Impact in Education. The Colusa County Office of Education has partnered with Oasis XRE to provide an educational Virtual Reality (VR) experience to students at CCOE's S. William Abel Academy. Students use their VR headsets and joysticks in short bursts during elective time, and have the opportunity to become certified in a handful of available CTE Certification courses. **Current** courses include Robotics, Drones, Nusing Assistant, Medical Assistant, Welding, Carpentry, Agricultural Science & Tech, and Veterinary Science.



DYNAMIC TRAININGS OFFERED AT EDUCATION VILLAGE

This school year, the Colusa County Office of Education has been hosting trainings aimed at supporting departments within CCOE, districts, and afterschool programs countywide. The purpose of the trainings focuses on research-based professional development and technical assistance to enhance instructional practices. The goal is to support staff members in implementing effective instructional practices that foster student achievement and meet the diverse needs of students. "These trainings aim to empower educators with the knowledge and skills necessary to create a supportive learning environment and promote academic success," stated Veronica Sandoval, Director of Curriculum, Instruction, and Accountability. Recent trainings have covered topics such as updates to the new math framework, the science of reading through the 5 Pillars of Literacy, and technical assistance with Beyond SST.


