Superintendent's Message



Hello Colusa County Community! I am writing to you today to inform you of a development in the Opioid Addiction Epidemic that has plagued the United States for decades. This new crisis involves a potentially fatal drug called "Rainbow Fentanyl." This opioid is highly addictive and potentially deadly, and has been found in at least 18 states, including our own.

What is most disturbing about Rainbow Fentanyl is that it has been deliberately created to look like candy. The pills come in a variety of bright colors, shapes, and sizes. This was done to purposefully target children and young adults. The intention of the drug cartels who produce this product is to begin the cycle of addiction for our community's youth.

Even more troubling, is that Rainbow Fentanyl exposure can lead to death simply by the touch of a hand, or by touching someone who has ingested the drug. This is because fentanyl is 80 to 100 times more potent than morphine and 40 to 50 times more potent than heroin.

My intention of this message is not to evoke fear or panic, but to initiate a conversation about this new trend in the opioid epidemic. With the holiday season right around the corner, this discussion is all the more essential. Any pill, regardless of its color, shape, or size that does not come from a health care provider or pharmacist can contain fentanyl and be deadly. What can we do, as a community, to take precautions?

1. Anyone who encounters fentanyl in any form should not handle it and should call 911 immediately.
2. Speak with your students or your children about this trend, so they know the risks of ingesting or sharing what appears to be candy but may in fact be fentanyl in disguise.
3. If your child went trick or treating this Halloween, check their candy.
4. Contact Colusa County Behavioral Health 24/7 at (530) 458-0520 to get help for a friend or loved one struggling with substance abuse. Colusa County Behavioral Health is located at 162 E. Carson St., Suite A, in Colusa.

As usual, the safety and well-being of our youth is paramount. Let us band together to keep each other safe. Let us work together to fight this epidemic.


Bright Vista Youth Center Offering Monthly Activities

Located at 304 5th Street in Colusa, the center is open Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday from 3:00pm-6:00pm, Wednesday from 2:00pm-6:00pm, and Saturday from 11:00am-3:00pm.

Bright Vista is dedicated to helping Colusa County youth learn techniques that will enhance their social, coping, and leadership skills through supportive workshops and structured daily activities. This drop-in center will explore educational and career interests and prepare participants for independent living to improve confidence and ensure success in their futures.

Bright Vista Youth Center is funded by Mental Health Services Act Prevention and Early Intervention making this program a free resource for the community. Youth are welcome to access and utilize the youth center once a membership packet is completed with their caregiver. County staff will always be onsite during operating hours to supervise youth, assist with activities and groups, meet with parents, and answer any questions about the program.
